# NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL



"I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world." John 6:51

The Church in the United States is about to begin the process of a three-year long Eucharistic revival in the life of the Church—Beginning on June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2022 (Corpus Christi Sunday), the Catholic Church throughout the United States, including our own diocese, will be beginning the celebration of the National Eucharistic Revival. This revival will include different events aimed at renewing our lives centered in the Eucharist, such as the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana in July of 2024.

In our local parish community, we will be celebrating the beginning of the National Eucharistic Revival on Sunday, June 19<sup>th</sup> with a Eucharistic Procession immediately following the 12:00 p.m. Mass. The procession will conclude with benediction in the Church. All are invited to attend this special event in our parish community as we strive to reaffirm Christ's true presence in the Eucharist and remind ourselves of the Eucharist as being the "source and summit of the Christian Life" (CCC 1324). # THEOLOGICAL TIDBITS LEARNING TO JOURNEY TOGETHER AS CATHOLICS



As we continue our journey this week, we will be introduced to the ministry of the lector.

Actually, the ministry of the lector has its origin in one of the steps that men studying for the priesthood embrace as they advance, step by step, in the various ministries leading to the ordination of the priesthood.

Their ministry is centuries old and looks no different than what we see in our lectors each week. So, technically these men are lectors, and the lay persons are readers. However, local practice has referred to the lay person who reads at liturgical functions as a lector and that is the term we will use here.

The ministry of the parish lector can be embraced by men and women. They are asked to have good diction, inflection, projection, eye contact with the assembly and of course, great respect for the Word of God. Lectors are asked to prayerfully prepare for this ministry before the Mass or prayer service in which they participate. Books with the Sunday readings are offered to them so they can prepare their readings in advance. Minimal training is offered in the logistics of when to go up to the ambo during the Mass.

This ministry is also exercised at funerals and weddings because the communication of the word of God is essential at these liturgical functions.

You might wonder why the lector does not read the Gospel. This is reserved for an ordained person: a deacon or a priest.

But the role of the parish lector is a very important one, and we should be very grateful to all who offer their services to this ministry. Maybe God is calling you to be a lector at our parish. We can never have enough persons to do this. It is Ideal, to have a different person do each reading but, in most parishes, there are not enough lectors to do so. Remember: this minister represents all of us since we cannot do this as a group. Is God asking you to be a parish lector?

#### **FACE MASKS**

The Diocesan guidelines continue to strongly recommend vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals to wear masks inside for Mass and other indoor gatherings in order to protect the health and safety of all in attendance. We are most grateful for the cooperation regarding the mask request with our goal of protecting our neighbors. At this time and as long as case counts remain low, masks are optional. You are reminded to continue to maximize the use of space as much as possible.

# **DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION**


Mask wearing for distribution of Holy Communion will be optional, at the discretion of the minister of Holy Communion. The minister must stop and sanitize his/her hands if direct contact is made with a person's tongue before continuing. We respectfully request anyone who wishes to receive communion on their tongue to go to the end of the line. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.

# **HAND HYGIENE**

Hand washing and sanitizing are essential in preventing the spread of the virus. It is highly recommended that everyone takes advantage of the sanitizers located at the entrances of the church. The Sign of Peace will be extended without physical contact.
