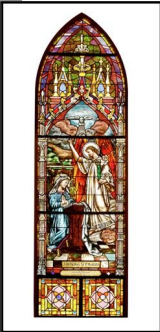

**Sonship Restored**

Strangely enough and discouragingly often, we find the attitude of the older son from the Prodigal Son parable in the Church. The righteous believers who have always belonged can be jealous and look down upon the poor sinner who comes later and gets the same reward.

Yet, the attitude of all of us toward those who are spiritually, morally, or materially needy should be that of the loving father so wonderfully shown in the statue by Francesco Messina.

The sinner comes back in shame, weakness, and obvious failure. His very act of returning is a cry for help, support, and understanding. The father offers his mercy and compassion without questions, without an interrogation. His shoulder is never too proud, too hard, or righteous to be refused as a pillow for the humiliated soul who returns broken, pillaged, and ruined by sin.

Messina chose to show the father and son naked because it symbolizes mankind stripped to its essence. And in this you reveal greatness. Humanity is noblest when admitting its weakness. Humanity is greatest in its ability to show mercy and lift the downtrodden. The father-son relationship is most beautiful when it is being reconciled and restored.

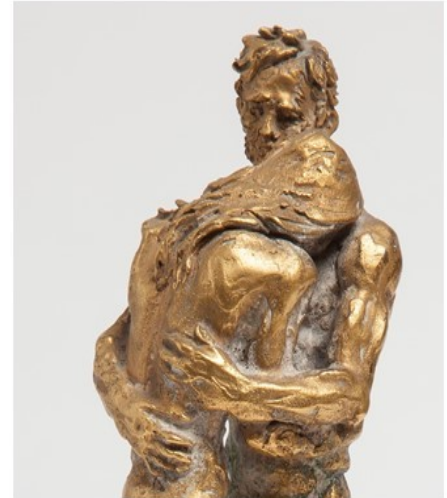
We should always rejoice at the return of a prodigal child, and we should always honor a forgiving parental heart. "We must celebrate and rejoice," said the father. If we are convinced of this, we now have a charge: Go out and find the lost coin and welcome back the lost sheep with humility and joy!

Location: Vatican Museums

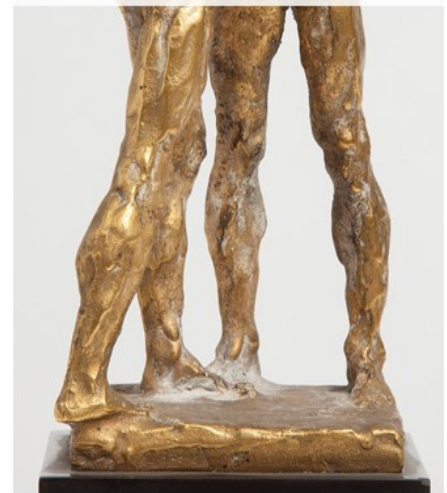

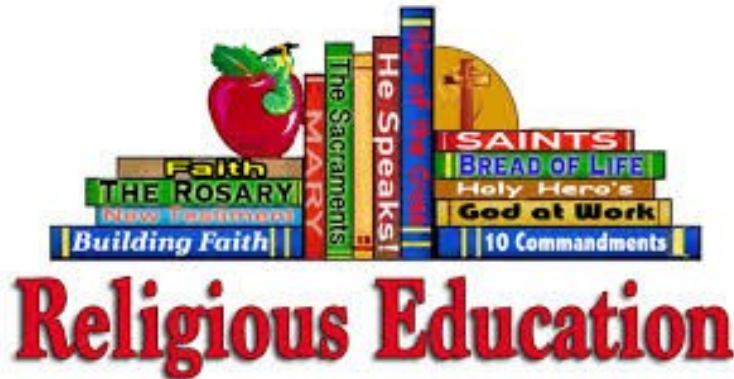

**ST. AGNES - SEPTEMBER SAINT OF THE MONTH**

Although Saint Agnes was born at the end of the third century, her story is relevant in these times when predatory sexual behavior is in the headlines and women are fighting to be treated with dignity and respect. Agnes was born into a wealthy and prominent Roman family and she was a beautiful young girl. Many men wanted to marry her. But Agnes chose to devote herself to Christ and be chaste, flying in the face of the patriarchal customs of the time. After a significant struggle, Agnes was given the choice to marry or be sent as a slave to a house of prostitution. In the ensuing struggle Agnes was stabbed and died at the age of twelve. This brave young woman was regarded as saintly soon after her death. She symbolizes the ongoing struggle of people to have the right to say no and make their own life decisions. Her feast day is January 21st and she is the patroness of youth, chastity and rape victims. To find her window, stand at the back of the church facing the altar and look left. Perhaps we should be cognizant of the fact that traditionally the followers of Jesus valued the right to say no and to choose ones calling and beliefs. We could pray to Saint Agnes to awaken powerful people to this truth.

St. Ignatius Parish will once again be hosting Mother Teresa’s Haven in Conlan Hall from **September 16th-22nd**. We are currently looking for sponsor groups to plan, supply, and cook meals for two of those nights: Thursday, September 19th & Friday, September 20th. In addition, we welcome any individuals who can help support the work of Mother Teresa’s Haven on any of the scheduled nights—from helping with kitchen prep, to serving, to sharing fellowship with our guests, to dishwashing and cleaning up.

Sponsor groups (usually 4 to 6 people per group) cover all aspects of their given night, from planning the meal, to shopping for food, to cooking and serving the meal, to cleaning up. Dinner is served at 5:30 each night, and clean up is usually completed by around 8:00. Members from volunteer groups who are cooking the meal that evening should plan to arrive earlier as needed for food preparation.

Individuals who want to offer supplemental support (from kitchen prep through clean up) on any given night are always welcome.

We welcome and invite any food donations parishioners might be able to offer in support of this ministry. Breads and homemade desserts are especially welcome.

We extend a special welcome and invitation to those who have never had the chance to support and participate in Mother Teresa’s Haven and would like to become involved this time around.
