FACE MASKS

The Diocesan guidelines continue to strongly recommend vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals to wear masks inside for Mass and other indoor gatherings in order to protect the health and safety of all in attendance. At this time and as long as case counts remain low, masks are optional. You are reminded to continue to maximize the use of space as much as possible.

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

Mask wearing for distribution of Holy Communion will be optional, at the discretion of the minister of Holy Communion.

We respectfully request anyone who wishes to receive communion on their tongue to go to the end of the line.

The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.


HAND HYGIENE

NEW MASS SCHEDULE

The Transition Team for the parishes of Holy Family and St. Ignatius Loyola have been meeting to continue discussions and preparation for the linkage of our two parishes. We prayerfully considered all possible options for creating the New Mass Schedule.

In developing the Mass Schedule, the Transition Team studied factors such as minimizing disruption for parishioners, appreciation of times for Religious Education and families already attending Mass, expected Saturday funerals and weddings, and allowing sufficient time for the priests to travel, prepare, and interact with parishioners. In assessing average attendance, The Transition Team carefully considered the impact that the COVID pandemic has had on attendance during the past two years. The ultimate goal was to create a new Mass schedule that could be accomplished by our priests on a regular basis, while giving precedent to all the above elements of parish life.

After extensive discussion, prayer and exploring multiple options it was the consensus of the Transition Team that the **following Mass schedule will begin on July 16**, **2022.**

PRACTICAL INFORMATION REGARDING LINKAGE

- 1. Church Envelopes will be returned to the Parish of origin on Mondays. All donations will be kept separate, and parish of origin will credit parishioners accordingly.
- 2. Rectory Staff will be contacting those who have scheduled 12:10 p.m. Masses to reschedule the Mass to the next available 7:30 a.m. or weekend Mass.
- 3. At present no new Mass intentions can be accepted until the process explained in item 2 is completed.
- 4. Holy Family Church is located at 574 Bennett Street, Luzerne, PA.
- 5. Holy Family Church is 1.1 mile away from St. Ignatius Church.
- 6. Holy Family Parish does have a large parking lot on the right side of the Church.
- 7. Holy Family Church has an elevator. Please use the side door from the parking lot to gain access.
- 8. To contact a parish priest for a medical emergency or to schedule a funeral when the office is closed, please call 570-479-6983. A priest is always on call.
- 9. Live-stream Mass time will be changed to 10:30 a.m. on Sundays the weekend of July 16-17, 2022. The 10:30 a.m. Mass will continue to be a public Mass as well.
- 10. Those who presently serve as Lectors or Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion are asked to contact the rectory regarding Mass time preferences for continuing their ministry due to new Mass Schedule.
