OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

Dear Parishioners of Saint Ignatius Loyola Parish,

In 2019, well before any of us knew about the approaching COVID-19 pandemic, the Diocese of Scranton began a long-range pastoral planning process with clergy and parish leaders. The Vision 2030 Blueprint Process that we began aims to look proactively at the realities of our local church in the present moment, while striving to meet the opportunities and challenges of the coming decade. The goal is to create vibrant parish communities rooted in the life of Jesus Christ.

As we strive to be a "mission-driven" church, we must all work together in a way that we best live out our baptismal calling in both a world - and local environment - that continues to change. Our Church faces significant challenges, among which are a fewer number of parishioners, financial sustainability questions, facility infrastructure needs and a diminishing number of ordained priests.

With this in mind, I write to inform you that Father Jarrod Waugh, CSC, administrator of Holy Family Parish, Luzerne, will be leaving his current position for a new ministry assignment within the Congregation of the Holy Cross on June 30, 2022. We are so thankful for his dedicated and faithful service to Holy Family Parish over the last two years! At this time, the Congregation of the Holy Cross is unable to provide another priest who could serve at Holy Family Parish.

In recognition of all that our Church faces, and after consultation with your Pastor and Parish Pastoral and Finance Council members, I have directed that the parishes of Holy Family, Luzerne, and Saint Ignatius Loyola, Kingston, be brought together in a linkage, with a single Pastor.

Your Pastoral and Finance Council members have acknowledged this change will take careful planning and both parishes will participate in the discussions about the particulars of linking under one pastor. This is not a consolidation, although your discussion may lead to that at some point in the future. With the Grace of God, all involved in this linkage will continue to serve and minister to our Lord and His Holy People.

Parishes involved in a linkage, by necessity, cooperate more closely than other parishes and do many things cooperatively, such as programs, and are encouraged to work toward combining Pastoral Council meetings and establishing common committees where possible.

Please know this decision is just the very first step in a process that will require the involvement and engagement of all of you, our faithful parishioners. There will be many questions to be examined and choices that will need to be made when this linkage occurs in July. A team with members from both parishes, assisted by Diocesan staff, will be created to accompany and guide the transition process. Professionals in pastoral formation, financial planning and engineering are also ready to contribute to the development of this new linkage in any way that is necessary.

While I know change is never easy, be assured of my deep gratitude for all that you and your families have shared, and continue to share, in furthering the mission of the Church. As you know, our mission is to take Christ into the world. I am confident that by working together we can "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15).

Be assured that you are in my prayers as this process towards a new hope-filled future begins.




MAY CROWNING MAY 1st


FINANCIAL UPDATE FOR APRIL 24, 2022

Diocese of Scranton Guidelines for Public Masses **Revised April 25, 2022**

FACE MASKS

The Diocesan guidelines continue to strongly recommend vaccinated and nonvaccinated individuals to wear masks inside for Mass and other indoor gatherings in order to protect the health and safety of all in attendance. We are most grateful for the cooperation regarding the mask request with our goal of protecting our neighbors. At this time and as long as case counts remain low, masks are optional. You are reminded to continue to maximize the use of space as much as possible.

DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION

Mask wearing for distribution of Holy Communion will be optional, at the discretion of the minister of Holy Communion. The minister must stop and sanitize his/her hands if direct contact is made with a person's tongue before continuing. We respectfully request anyone who wishes to receive communion on their tongue to go to the end of the line. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.

HAND HYGIENE

Hand washing and sanitizing are essential in preventing the spread of the virus. It is highly recommended that everyone takes advantage of the sanitizers located at the entrances of the church. The Sign of Peace will be extended without physical contact.

LIVE STREAMING MASS

We will continue to livestream the 8:30 a.m. Mass for those who must stay home. The 8:30 a.m. Mass continues to be available for in-person attendance as well.



Seeking Nominations for Parish Pastoral Council April 2nd – May 1st

Please consider nominating yourself or someone you think would be a viable candidate for membership on the Parish Pastoral Council. We are currently seeking five new members who will serve for a term of two years with the option of continuing for two additional terms. The Council, which includes 12 parishioners, meets monthly and works closely with the pastoral leadership in guiding the direction our parish will take. All candidates must be an active member of St. Ignatius and at least 18 years of age. In the back of the church, you will find a table which contains detailed information on the nomination and selection process as well as the purpose and work of the Parish Council. On May 5th, all candidates will be invited to an information session. This is an excellent opportunity for anyone genuinely interested in the future of St. Ignatius Parish to get involved and to work with others in making a difference.

Nomination Process for the Parish Pastoral Council

Starting April 2nd and continuing till May 1st, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) will seek nominations to fill five positions for the fall. We invite and encourage you to become involved in the process, either by nominating yourself or someone you know who may help with the work of the PPC.

What is the PPC?

The PPC serves as a visioning and consultative body to the pastor and, in addition to the parish leadership, includes 12 selected parishioners. The PPC is responsible for planning and articulating the course our parish will follow. In addition to planning, the PPC works closely with the four Commissions, the Finance Council, and others to assist the parish in accomplishing the goals for Word, Worship, Community and Service.

How Much Time will I Give as a Member of the PPC?

The PPC meets monthly on the third Monday at 6:30 p.m. with the exceptions of July and December. Members are selected for a two-year term and may choose to serve for two additional terms; however, membership is limited to six years. Terms are staggered so that every two years some members will transition off and new members will begin. We are currently seeking five new members who will assume their seats in September.

How Do I Know if I Should Consider Membership on the PPC?

We are looking for people who are genuinely interested in the future of St. Ignatius Parish. We are looking for people who can work collaboratively with other parishioners in planning and identifying goals to meet the needs of our parish. All candidates must be 18 years old and active members of St. Ignatius.

How Does the Nomination Process Work?

You may submit your name or the name of someone you think would make a good candidate in a few ways. First, you can complete and submit one of the nomination forms found in the vestibule of the church. Second, you can contact a current member of the PPC with a name. Third, you can send an email <u>officemanager@stignatiuspa.com</u>. In the subject line note "PPC Candidate" and your name or person you are nominating in the body of the email. As indicated above, nominations begin April 1st and end May 1st.

How Does the Selection Process Work?

All persons nominated will be contacted to confirm their interest and invited to an information session on May 5th at 6:30 p.m. At the close of the session, nominees will be asked to take home reflection questions on parish life and return their responses to the Rectory by Noon on May 12th. The PPC will discern and identify new members at their May meeting, and members selected will be announced by June 1st.
