

Is Christ Divided?

Christ!" Saint Paul might have said this to members of the Corinthian community who rival each other, claiming that the leader who baptized them is greater than the one who baptized others: "I belong to Paul...I belong to Apollos...I belong to Cephas" (1 Corinthians 1:12). This suggests that, based on their baptizer, the members themselves are superior. Such rivalry sounds so petty. We should be careful here, because some of this rivalry still exists in the Church.

In any healthy group there will be diverse opinions. We all have our own tastes, preferences, cultural habits, and so on. This is true in church music, preaching style, and religious devotion. The uniformity of the Church prior to the Second Vatican Council has given way to great diversity. What is different is not necessarily bad. Nor is our preference necessarily superior. Such diversity need not pit us against each other, but sometimes it does. Is Christ divided over points of preference?

We are all part of the body of Christ; we are all God's beloved. The diversity among us challenges us to work toward the common good, to "be united in the same mind and in the same purpose" (1 Corinthians 1:10). Let us not divide Christ.

On Wednesday, February 26th, Ash Wednesday, each of us will be visibly Catholic and marked by an ashen cross on the forehead. This symbol is not only a sign of public penance, but also our link to Palm Sunday of last year. The ashes should be of the burnt palm we have had in our homes since last year. It will be burned and the resulting ash used to sign the faithful at the beginning of Lent. Baskets for palm branches will be available in the Church and Chapel beginning next weekend. We encourage your participation in this aspect of our Lenten liturgy.


ISLI LEADERSHIP RETREAT - FEBRUARY 14-16, 2020
