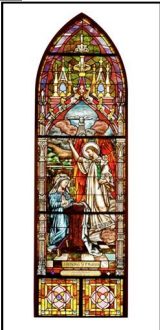

## You Are Really Something!

The description of the disciples found in today's Gospel is an impressive compliment—and an even greater challenge. Jesus tells them they are “salt of the earth” (Matthew 5:13), bringing out the good taste of living. In other words, life would be bland and uninteresting without them. They are also the “light of the world” (Matthew 5:14), helping people find their way. Without them, others would stumble and fall. Jesus is telling them how important they are in the lives of others. They could each and all say: I am really something!

Such compliments are also a challenge. What must one do to be salt and light in the lives of others? The Isaian passage provides some suggestions: Share your bread with the hungry; shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked; don't turn your back on your own; remove from your midst oppression, false accusation, and malicious speech. In other words, to be salt or light is to meet the needs of the needy. This teaching of Jesus is not as easy as it might at first look.

Jesus is speaking to his disciples, his followers. They are not those who are simply curious about this itinerant preacher or remarkable healer. They have chosen to follow him, not merely from place to place, but to model their lives after his. Isn't that what we also claim to be—his followers? Haven't we promised to model our lives after his? If so, as both compliment and challenge he says to us as well, “You are really something!”

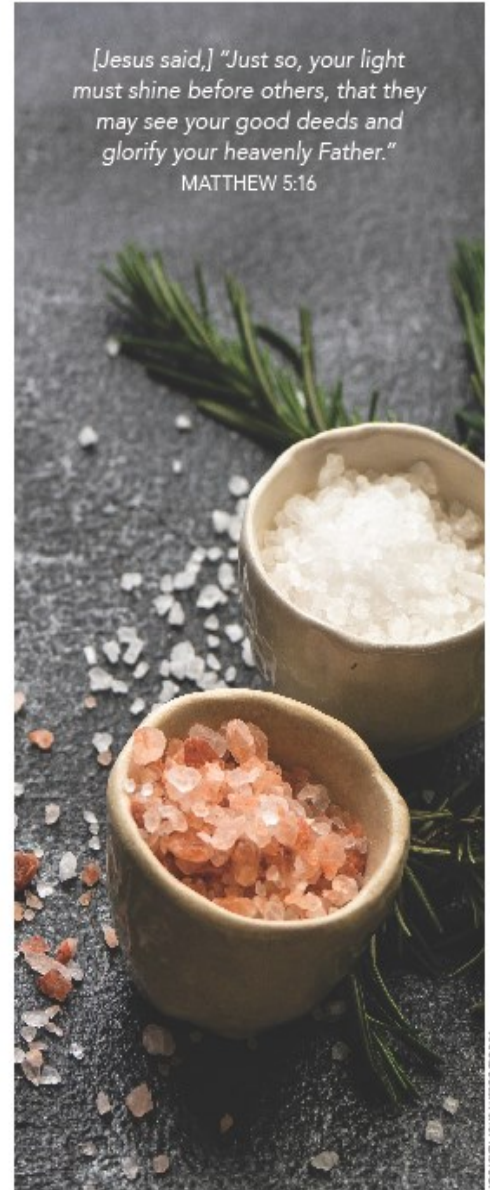

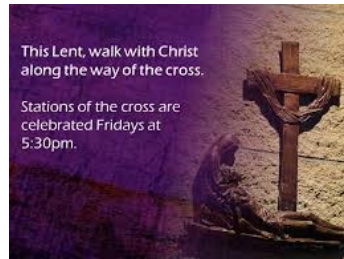

**ADULT FAITH FORMATION**

### STATIONS OF THE CROSS 2020

St. Ignatius Loyola Parish listened carefully to the homily on the Second Sunday of Advent delivered by Bishop Bambera presenting the beginning of a process for all the parishes within the Diocese of Scranton to think about the challenges and opportunities that we will face within the next ten years.

We heard the message and know we must respond to the changes in terms of demographics, an aging population, and the shifts in the make-up of some communities that factor into the situation. Also, the expected diminishment of ordained priests that will be available to serve full-time in our parishes.

Therefore, we are preparing to determine how we should respond to prepare for these realities within our parish. One such way is to begin having our parishioners assume responsibilities that are not limited solely to a priest (i.e. Mass, Confession, Sacraments).

This year the Stations of the Cross will be led by various laypersons from our parish each Friday at 5:30 PM. We are pleased that so many of our faithful have accepted this invitation to lead the weekly devotion and we ask for your understanding as well as your support. We know that this is another way for us to respond to our individual calling given to us as baptized followers of Jesus Christ. God bless us as we face our future with hope to ensure we remain a vibrant parish community!

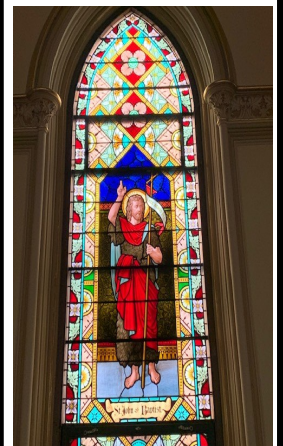
**NOTICE REGARDING REPORTING  
 SEXUAL ABUSE OF A MINOR**

It is the policy of the Diocese of Scranton to report any allegation of sexual abuse of a minor to law enforcement. If you are a victim of sexual abuse committed by a priest, deacon, religious or lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton, you are encouraged to immediately report the matter to law enforcement. If any priest, deacon, religious, lay employee or volunteer of the Diocese of Scranton has cause or reason to suspect that a minor has been subjected to any form of abuse, including child sexual abuse, the matter will be reported to law enforcement. It is also the policy of the Diocese to adhere to all civil and state regulations. In accordance with the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania’s Child Protective Services Laws, reports of suspected child abuse should also be made immediately by phone to the 24-Hour Child Abuse hotline (ChildLine) at 1-800-932-0313 or electronically at [www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis](http://www.compass.state.pa.us/cwis) To this end, the Diocese is equally committed to adhering to the norms of the Code of Canon Law and to upholding the tenets of the USCCB Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, which includes supporting victims of sexual abuse in their pursuit of emotional and spiritual well-being. As such, information regarding an allegation of sexual abuse of a minor should also be reported to the Victim Assistance Coordinator, Mary Beth Pacuska at (570-862-7551).

We extend a special welcome and invitation to those who have never had the chance to support and participate in Mother Teresa's Haven and would like to become involved this time around.
