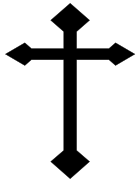
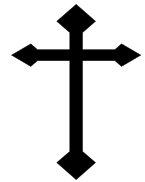

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Baptisms: Parents are expected to be registered parishioners who attend weekly Mass. Please call the Office to arrange for the Baptism & pre-Baptismal Instructions. Classes are scheduled as needed.

Marriage: Diocesan Policy states that those considering reception of the Sacrament of Matrimony must meet with the Pastor at least 6 months before a desired wedding date. *No date should be set before meeting with the Pastor.* Pre-Cana Instructions are required. Please call the Office for more information.

RCIA: Please call the Office to arrange Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults instruction for adults/older children wishing to become members of the Catholic Church.

Anointing of the Sick/Hospital Calls: Please notify the Office of those sick or hospitalized. Due to the pandemic, we are not making regular hospital visits, but a priest will administer the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick when needed.

Religious Education: Grades 1-6 Classes meet in Good Shepherd Academy, 316 N. Maple Avenue, Kingston, each Sunday, September-May, 9:15-10:20 AM. Classes for Grades 7 & 8 meet in Bergen Hall, 335 N. Maple Ave., Kingston, on alternating Sundays from 6:30 to 7:30 PM.

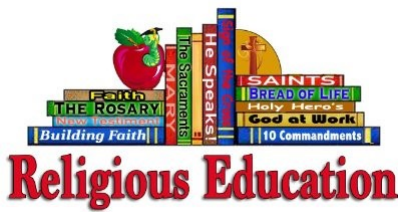

Blessing of a Home at Epiphany

The Epiphany is traditionally celebrated on the 12th day after Christmas. This year it will be celebrated on January 8, 2023. We invite you to continue the tradition of blessing the door to your home on Epiphany. In years gone by, the priest or deacons would try to visit the homes of all parishioners during the season; although this tradition is no longer common, many families continue to mark the lintels of the door and hold a simple prayer service to ask God's blessing on their home and on those who live in or visit the home. It is an invitation for Jesus to be a daily guest in our home, to bless our comings and goings, our conversations, our work and play, and our joys and sorrows. Chalk and a card with an Epiphany blessing will be available in the back of the Church after all Masses on the weekends of Dec 31/Jan 1 & Jan 7/8.



The Solemnity of Mary Mother of God

falls exactly one week after Christmas, the end of the octave of Christmas. It is fitting to honor Mary as Mother of Jesus, following the birth of Christ. When Catholics celebrate the Solemnity we are not only honoring Mary, who was chosen among all women throughout history to bear God incarnate, but we are also honoring our Lord, who is fully God and fully human. Calling Mary "mother of God" is the highest honor we can give Mary. Just as Christmas honors Jesus as the "Prince of Peace," the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God honors Mary as the "Queen of Peace"

Around 500 AD the Eastern Church celebrated a "Day of the Theotokos (or God-bearer)" before or after Christmas. This celebration eventually evolved into a Marian feast on December 26 in the Byzantine calendar and January 16 in the Coptic calendar. In the West, the eighth day of the octave of Christmas was celebrated as the Feast of the Circumcision of Jesus. The push for an official feast day celebrating Mary's divine maternity started around 1751 in Portugal, and by 1914 was being celebrated on October 11. The feast of Mary's divine maternity became a universal feast in 1931.

Following Vatican II, Pope Paul VI decided to change the feast of Jesus' Circumcision to the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God to reclaim the ancient Western Marian emphasis on the Octave of Christmas. With this change, Pope Paul VI highlighted the feast's celebration of both Mary and Jesus. He also noted the connection to New Year's Day and Mary's role as Queen of Peace. January 1st, the Solemnity of Mary Mother of God, is also the observed "World Day of Peace."



CHRISTMAS COLLECTION – Each year, the Christmas collection is a tremendous support for the parish budgets. We celebrate the great gift of God to us; Christ is born and has given us the fullness of life. Our generosity should mirror God's generous love. As you pray about your gift to the church during this holy season, remember God's generosity to you! You may still contribute to the Christmas collection through January 8, 2023, the end of Christmas season.

Delivering Wednesday Meals for Mother Teresa's Haven—January through March 2023

Since the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, the St. Ignatius Service Commission, with the generous support of our entire parish community, has worked to stay in touch with and provide meals for the men of Mother Teresa's Haven. These ministry efforts now include weekly meal preparation and delivery each Wednesday to the shelter's current location – St. Mary's/Our Lady of Fatima in Wilkes-Barre. Thank you to all who responded to our call for volunteers to help provide these meals over the past year. We plan to continue this ministry through at least March 2023 and are looking for volunteers to provide Wednesday meals from January through March. The commitment involves preparing a meal for approximately 25 men that will be dropped off to the shelter between 5:00 PM and 6:00 PM on the Wednesday for which you are scheduled. Meals can be dropped off hot or warm; the men also have access to two ovens in the shelter, so chilled meals are an option too. If you are able to prepare a meal, members of the Service Commission are happy to help by picking the meal up from you at your home and delivering it for you. If you prefer to provide a catered meal and arrange for delivery that way, that option is also available. If you are interested in participating in this ministry, or if you have any questions about getting involved, please contact Tom Hamill at 570-852-1183. All visitations to homes and hospitals remain limited based upon restrictions of individual health care facilities' protocols. CDC guidelines must be followed.

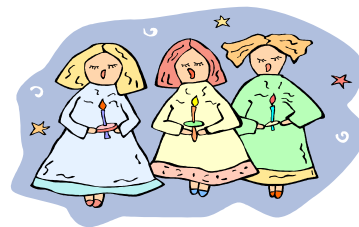
