

FEAST OF ST. IGNATIUS OF LOYOLA

We are truly blessed to celebrate one of our three patronal feasts. Our parish will join together to commemorate the Feast of St. Ignatius of Loyola, July 31st. Saint Ignatius (established 1875) was one of three parishes consolidated (2007 – 2009) into St. Ignatius Loyola Parish. As the parishes joined together building on each of their rich traditions we have maintained and expanded a strong Catholic presence as was the hope of our predecessors.

Reflection

"St. Ignatius of Loyola was first and foremost a man of God. In his life, God was first. His greatest glory and his greatest service came first. He was a profoundly prayerful man from whom the daily celebration of the Eucharist was the heart and crowning point of his day. Thus, he left his followers a precious spiritual legacy that must not be lost or forgotten. Precisely because he was a man of God, St. Ignatius was a faithful servant of the Church, in which he saw and venerated the Bride of the Lord and the Mother of Christians. And from his desire to serve the Church in the most beneficial way possible, was born the special vow of obedience to the Pope, which he himself describes as "our first and principal foundation."

MASS SCHEDULE AND CONFESSION UPDATE EFFECTIVE AUGUST 14-15, 2021

Please know how grateful we are for your patience, understanding and support throughout the past sixteen months as we navigated through the global pandemic, COVID-19.

We have been notified that the dispensation in the Diocese of Scranton from the obligation to participate at Mass on Sundays and Holy Days will end on Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. All of the dioceses in Pennsylvania will do the same.

Bishop Bambera's letter was released on our Facebook page, website, and weekly bulletin last week, he encouraged us to take this opportunity to welcome our sisters and brothers back to in person attendance at Sunday Mass.

It is important to note that people who are seriously ill, have a health risk, or are struggling with fear or anxiety of gathering with others will be excused from Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation.

St. Ignatius Loyola Parish is pleased to welcome everyone to join us in person for the celebration of Mass. Our church building will continue to be properly ventilated, sanitized, and appropriate distancing will be maintained to provide a safe as well as a healthy space for Mass.



Diocese of Scranton
Guidelines for Public Masses
During the COVID-19 Pandemic
Effective June 28, 2021

We the Parish of St. Ignatius Loyola join with all the parishes of the Diocese of Scranton to joyfully welcome the faithful of the Diocese to return to our parish. Despite the challenges of the last year, we invite those who have not yet returned to Mass to rejoin us in person to celebrate the Holy Eucharist, the source and summit of the Christian life.

MASK GUIDANCE FOR MASSES

- The Pennsylvania Department of Health ended its mask mandate as of Monday, June 28, 2021. **People who are not vaccinated from COVID-19, or are not fully vaccinated, are still strongly encouraged to wear masks indoors and outdoors when around others** but are no longer required to do so. This means that in the parishes and institutions of the Diocese of Scranton, there is no requirement for face coverings or masks. Signs will be posted at the entrances encouraging unvaccinated and those individuals particularly vulnerable to wear a mask in church.
- Any individual is welcome to continue wearing a mask at Mass if desired for personal protection and/or comfort. Everyone is asked to be respectful of a person's choice to wear a face covering or mask in church.
- There will be no request by the parish regarding information about vaccination status to be admitted to the church.

OTHER IMPORTANT PROTOCOLS & SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

- Pews are no longer marked for physical distancing. We remind the faithful to continue to maximize the use of space as much as possible.
- Hand sanitizer will continue to be available in the church.
- The Sign of Peace will be celebrated without physical contact.
- The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.
- The Diocesan guidelines allow decisions to be made at the discretion of the individual parish regarding the following:
 - Altar servers may assist at Mass once again. Servers under the age of 18 will need parental permission.
 - Liturgical singing will be allowed – specifics to be determined.
 - Holy Water fonts will be refilled and utilized.

We will be implementing the return of these items in the coming weeks as the Pastoral Staff cautiously determine a timeline.

While ongoing progress is being made to address the spread of COVID-19 with vaccinations, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass and Masses on Holy Days will be reinstated on August 15th. St. Ignatius Loyola Parish is excited to welcome everyone to join us in person for the celebration of Mass. We will proceed with caution to ensure our faithful will return with full confidence in their health and safety while at church.
