# THEOLOGICAL TIDBITS

#### LEARNING TO JOURNEY TOGETHER AS CATHOLICS



We are now going to take a break in looking at the Mass. Instead, we will focus on the ministers who serve us during our celebrations.

There are many different types of liturgical ministries: Priest, deacon, Altar Server, Assembly, Lector, Cantor, Choir, Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist, and Usher/Greeter. Because all of us cannot be at the altar at the same time to do these ministries, each of these ministers (usually well-trained volunteers) represent us, the people in the pews, in their actions. We, the people in the pews are collectively called the assembly.

The **assembly** is asked to listen attentively to the prayers of the Mass we do not say out loud, and stand, sing, sit, sing, kneel, say our part of the Mass prayers, and participate in the processions. These are special signs that show that we are a community, praising God as His gathered people, not as individuals. This is why it is best to put away our rosaries, novenas and devotions until the Mass is finished. This time is special as we pray as a community to God the Father through His Son, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit.

This gathering together is nothing new. It has its roots in the Old Testament when the people did not have clocks. They were usually called to together by the sound of a horn, the shofar, summoning them to gather together to praise God the Father. What a beautiful sight it must have been! People coming from fields and houses and whatever else they were doing. What a wonderful sign it was to non- believers that this prayer they were going to was something special. So, we begin our ministry of the assembly as we gather together, coming from our homes, or wherever, to praise God together on Sunday. (Which really begins late on Saturday in Church time.)

As the New Testament unfolded, Jesus urged us to continue this as he told us "Wherever two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of them." And he is in the midst of us as the Church tells us that Christ is present in a special way in the assembly gathered for the Eucharist.

One special note about our participation, the assembly, in two processions: the taking up of the gifts and the Communion Rite.

Why not ask to bring up the gifts? .... . especially if the Mass is for a loved one.

Also, we are called, as part of our ministry, to walk, and sing together and make the same sign of reverence as we receive the Eucharist during the Communion Rite. Walking and singing is not easy, but we are asked to try.

So now you know you are a member of a special liturgical group called the **assembly**. Let us do our best to live up to this calling.

# Diocese of Scranton Guidelines for Public Masses **Revised April 25, 2022**

#### **FACE MASKS**

The Diocesan guidelines continue to strongly recommend vaccinated and non-vaccinated individuals to wear masks inside for Mass and other indoor gatherings in order to protect the health and safety of all in attendance. We are most grateful for the cooperation regarding the mask request with our goal of protecting our neighbors. At this time and as long as case counts remain low, masks are optional. You are reminded to continue to maximize the use of space as much as possible.

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION**

Mask wearing for distribution of Holy Communion will be optional, at the discretion of the minister of Holy Communion. The minister must stop and sanitize his/her hands if direct contact is made with a person's tongue before continuing. We respectfully request anyone who wishes to receive communion on their tongue to go to the end of the line. The distribution of the Precious Blood remains suspended at this time.

# **HAND HYGIENE**

Hand washing and sanitizing are essential in preventing the spread of the virus. It is highly recommended that everyone takes advantage of the sanitizers located at the entrances of the church. The Sign of Peace will be extended without physical contact.

#### **LIVE STREAMING MASS**

We will continue to livestream the 8:30 a.m. Mass for those who must stay home. The 8:30 a.m. Mass continues to be available for in-person attendance as well.
